Counselling Corner

Hello from the Counselling Corner and Happy October! This week we are going to look at separation anxiety.

What is Separation anxiety?

Separation anxiety occurs when a child is overly concerned or worried with the actual or anticipated separation from their attachment figure. Approximately 4% of children and youth suffer from separation anxiety and it is the most common anxiety disorder in children under the age of 12. Separation anxiety can interfere with a child's ability to attend school and extracurricular activities and can also be difficult for the entire family to manage.
