Elder Linda is both First Nations and Metis who is a former teacher. Her heart's desire is to share her culture with everyone at High Park! Students in Mrs. Worthington's Grade 4 class, Miss Abbas-Nejad's Grade 5 class and Mrs. Ziesman's Grade 6s had the opportunity to see artifacts Elder Linda brought in and they also enjoyed bannock with raspberry jam and "lumlass" (Cree for "honey butter")....DELICIOUS!! Throughout the remainder of the school year our students and staff will have the privilege of visits from First Nations Elder Violet Poitras, who will be sharing and teaching Stoney language as well as her knowledge of plants used for medicines. Elder Maryann Stepien is our Metis elder who will be teaching the role and importance of the Red River Cart. Students will be having the opportunity to build a model version of a cart using the different building materials available in the library. Wonderfully rich cultural opportunities for our students at High Park that are also a chance to continue our growth as a school community on our path to Truth and Reconciliation!

Our **Scholastic Book Fair** will be up and running from Oct.21-25 - what a fantastic way to support our school!! ADHD Awareness Month

October is Attention-deficity/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Awareness Month in Canada. ADHD is a complex disorder that impacts each individual differently. Symptoms of ADHD may include inattention, hyperactivity, impulsivity, difficulty with emotional regulation and impulse control. challenges with time management. and hyperfocus. ADHD affects approximately 3-7% of the childhood population and can impact a variety of areas such as school, relationships, and emotional regulation. ADHD can be managed through education, behavioral management, social medication skills training. and. for some. management. - Can also include: Parents of veterans, Branch of Service, Dates of Service, When they entered the military, Location of military training, Location of military service after training, Military Specialty, Division-Rgt-Batt-Co.-Squadron that the Veteran was attached to, Date of Discharge
